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

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



About the Artists

Dr. Sangmi Lim, a native of the Republic of Korea, is an active performer, appearing frequently as a soloist, chamber musician, and collaborative pianist. She earned her Bachelor and Master of Piano Performance degrees from Ewha Womans University in Korea, and also a Master of Collaborative Piano and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from Michigan State University. Lim's international presence extends from the Republic of Korea, Japan, Italy, Bosnia and Herzegovina to throughout the United States. Lim has appeared as a soloist with the Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra (IL), the Michigan State University Symphony Orchestra (MI), the Jackson Symphony Orchestra (MI), the Algeu Symphony (Germany), and the Kyounggi Philharmonic Orchestra (Repub¬lic of Korea). She has given solo recitals and chamber music performances in con-cert series and festivals, such as the Renaissance Festival (Italy), South Hampton Music Festival (New York), Schubertiade (Chicago), West Circle Series (MI), Lansing Symphony Chamber Music Series (MI), Absolute Music Chamber Series (MI), the Rising New Star Concert Series

(Republic of Korea), Live Concert Series with Arirang TV (Republic of Korea), and Sarajevo Chamber Music Festival (Bos-nia and Herzegovina). Lim has served as an adjudicator at many piano competi-tions including the Atlantic Music Festival Piano Concerto Competition (ME), Bolz Young Artist Competition (WI), Ann Arbor Society for Musical Arts Young Artist Competition (MI), Austin District Music Teachers Association Solo Con-test (TX), and Michigan Music Association Competition (MI). Lim has served as an Assistant Professor of Piano at Michigan State University and Lansing Community College. Currently, she holds the position of collaborative pianist at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi and is a faculty member at New England Music Camp. Additionally, she is a co-director of Piano Celebration Week at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

A native of Sarajevo, pianist Dr. Dino Mulić is a Yamaha Artist with a fascinating history. He grew up in Bosnia-Herzegovina during the war of the 1990s. His passion for music survived the

adversities of those years, instilling in him a strong work ethic and a keen sense of determination and persistence. He studied at the Academy of Music in Sarajevo and then at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where he earned his doctoral degree in piano performance and pedagogy. Mulić is an active recitalist, chamber musician, clinician, and adjudicator. He has performed in Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Canada, Croatia, Hungary, Italy, Serbia, and throughout the United States. He is an advocate of new music, and his repertoire includes works by Balkan and American composers, some of whom have written duets for him and his wife, Dr. Sangmi Lim. He has given presentations at a number of national and state conferences, including the Music Teachers National Association, the Texas Music Teachers Association Convention and the Music and Lifelong Learning Symposiums. He has presented on the importance of music education for all. In the spirit of community building, Mulić is a proponent of bringing together university faculty, independent music teachers, and local and national music organizations to celebrate the artistry of piano



performance. In 2010, Mulić founded the Sarajevo Chamber Music Festival, which features a week of concerts by world-renowned artists, as well as a ten-day educational program for young chamber musicians. Mulić's proudest achievement is the creation of Piano Celebration Week at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi. This annual festival features internationally renowned pianists, and the best and brightest young musicians from throughout the Coastal Bend, Central, and South Texas regions. This festival has transformed the piano community of Corpus Christi and inspired hundreds of budding pianists. Mulić has held faculty positions at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and at the University of Sarajevo. He is currently an Associate Professor of Music (Piano) at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi. He also serves as a faculty member at the New England Music Camp in Sidney, Maine, where he teaches applied piano and chamber music. Mulić lives in Corpus Christi with his wife Sangmi, and their two children, Luka and Ella.

AN INFORMAL CONVERSATION ABOUT MR. LEE'S BACKGROUND AND COMPETITION JOURNEY.



When did you start taking piano lessons?

I started piano lessons at the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music in Milwaukee when I was 6, though I didn't take it very seriously until high school, when my family moved to Salt Lake City, Utah. There I met my peers through the wringer of competitions. They played at such a high level that I was both inspired to improve my own playing and discouraged from pursuing music more seriously.

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Did you study piano in college?

After abandoning piano, I had no idea what I was going to do at MIT. I discovered I was pretty good at computer science, but after freshman year I missed music enough to resume piano lessons. I embarked on a career in software development and management, staying in Boston for another 7 years. I got myself a Boston upright piano, but hardly did anything but tinker on it.

How did you come back to music?

It wasn't until I moved to San Francisco that music's importance to me shifted. I learned through friends about a weekly "open mic" at a bar in the Mission District where classical musicians would meet. On the bar's beaten Yamaha upright I learned the standard piano chamber repertoire. Years later I decided I wanted to improve my playing, and started taking lessons again, which inspired me to participate in piano festivals and competitions for amateurs.

What is your music community like?


In contrast to the competitive environment in high school, I was heartened by the openness and supportiveness of the amateur piano community. Everyone is celebrated on their individual journey. Festivals and competitions turn into family reunions, and it's fun to meet people who love the piano and spend their free time practicing like you do.



I think every pianist deals with preparation for and stage anxiety from competitions and performances, and for me, my insights have come mostly outside of piano. Lessons from corporate project management applied to how I utilized my practice time at and away from the piano. Two activities I picked up during COVID, running and meditation, helped me hone skills I could use to redirect stage anxiety. I've also found it important finding community and camaraderie with other musicians, to feel less alone in an activity that is very much a solitary endeavor.







Since 2007, Belinda has been working as a collaborative pianist and piano professor at the Sarajevo Music High School, the one she attended as a child. Her students have been holders of numerous awards from national and international piano competitions. After completing their high school studies, her students are successfully continuing their university studies at prestigious universities such as Universitat fur Musik und darstellende Kunst im Wien (Austria), Cambridge University (UK), and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi (USA).

Belinda Krnić was born in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, in 1971. She completed her elementary musical education in the class of piano teacher Rahela Bajrektarević and continued with attending Sarajevo Music High School in the class of piano professor Zrinka Gavrić, both in Sarajevo.

Belinda studied at the Sarajevo Music Academy in the class of piano professor Aleksandra Romanić. When the war started in her home country, in 1991, she left for Vienna (Austria) and continued her education there in the class of professors Harald Ossberger and Michael Lipp. During her studies, Belinda was holder of scholarships granted by the Austrian Ministry of Education and Culture, for seven (7) years, and by the Tokyo Foundation, for one (1) year. She completed her piano studies (IGP) and earned her master's degree in 2004, in the class of professor Harald Ossberger with Magna cum Laude.

As a student, Belinda played at numerous concerts in Vienna, in different concert halls (Stadtinitiative Wien, Kultur Center Wahring) but also in other Austrian cities and concert halls such as Viktringschloss Klagenfurt and Miraebelschloss Salzburg.

After completing her studies in Vienna, Belinda moved to China where she worked as a piano professor at the Weifang University and Zhengzhou Conservatory.

About the Artist

American pianist Clayton Stephenson's love for music is immediately apparent in his joyous charisma onstage, expressive power, and natural ease at the instrument. Hailed for "extraordinary narrative and poetic gifts" and interpretations that are "fresh, incisive and characterfully alive" (Gramophone), he is committed to making an impact on the world through his music-making.

Growing up in New York City, Clayton started piano lessons at age 7 and was accepted into the Juilliard Outreach Music Advancement Program for underprivileged children the next year, where he attended numerous student recitals and fell in love with music. At the age of 10 he advanced to Juilliard's elite Pre-College program with the help of his teacher, Beth Nam. At Juilliard he studied with Matti Raekallio, Hung-Kuang Chen and Ernest Barretta. Clayton practiced on a synthesizer at home until he found an old upright piano on the street that an elementary school had thrown away; that would become his practice piano for the next six years, until the Lang Lang Foundation donated a new piano to him when he was 17.

He credits the generous support of community programs with providing him musical inspiration and resources along the way. As he describes it, the "3rd Street Music School jump-started my music education; the Young People's Choir taught me phrasing and voicing; the Juilliard Outreach Music Advancement Program introduced me to formal and rigorous piano training, which enabled me to get into Juilliard Pre-College; the Morningside Music Bridge validated my talent and elevated my self-confidence; the Boy's Club of New York exposed me to jazz; and the Lang Lang Foundation brought me to stages worldwide and transformed me from a piano student to a young artist."

Piano Competition

Recent and upcoming highlights of Clayton's burgeoning career include appearances with the Calgary Philharmonic, Chicago Sinfonietta, and the Fort Worth, Louisville, Lansing and North Carolina Symphony Orchestras; as well as recitals at the Phillips Collection Concert Series in Washington, DC, Foundation Louis Vuitton Auditorium in Paris, Bad Kissinger Sommer Festival and BeethovenFest in Germany, Colour of Music Festival, Ravinia Festival and Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall. He has been featured on NPR, WUOL, and WQXR, and appeared in the "GRAMMY® Salute to Classical Music" Concert at Carnegie's Stern Auditorium.

He now studies in the Harvard-NEC Dual Degree Program, pursuing a bachelor's degree in economics at Harvard and a master's degree in piano performance at the New England Conservatory under Wha Kyung Byun. And his accolades along the way have been numerous - in addition to being the first Black finalist at the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in 2022, he was named a 2022 Gilmore Young Artist, as well as a 2017 U.S. Presidential Scholar in the Arts and a Young Scholar of the Lang Lang International Music Foundation. He also received a jury discretionary award at the 2015 Cliburn International Junior Piano Competition and Festival.


